# Report of the Bulgarian Presidency of the Boards of Inspectors and Joint Teaching Committee – 2013-2014 school year

**BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE EUROPEAN SCHOOLS** 

Meetings on 2, 3 and 4 December 2014 - Brussels

## Introduction

The last school year was marked by Croatia's accession to the European Union, which increased the number of category I pupils in the European Schools. It was important for us to follow the principles established, jointly with the Pedagogical Development Unit, by the previous Presidency: unity, transparency and continuity.

The European School system is not simply an optimum education system but also a structure that defends and promotes European education with a view to the development of European competences. With that in mind, the Presidency defined its priorities in 2013-2014 as follows:

- Harmonisation and concordance of L2 syllabuses with the Common European Framework.
- Revision/adaptation of syllabuses by subject with a view to shifting their focus from knowledge-based to competence-based learning.
- Harmonisation of teaching methods with a view to implementation of teaching standards by organising regular in-school exchanges of experience/attending other teachers' classes of the same type, for example, teaching geography in French or in German or teaching Spanish or English and also as L3.
- Assessment of pupils.

The education provided by the European School system is monitored by the Boards of Inspectors. Very often inspectors combine their work for the European Schools with other national duties. I would like to pay tribute to their passion and sustained efforts by raising the visibility of their work behind the scenes.

The Boards of Inspectors' activities in 2013-2014 involved consideration and approval of important documents at their meetings. Those documents seek to improve the quality of the education offered in the European School system.

The results of the various activities of the Boards of Inspectors carried out during the 2013-2014 school year and a list of the documents approved and which, what is more, are to become applicable in the next school year can be found in Annex 2 to the document, under the reference number 2013-08-D-12-en-6.

## I. Board of Inspectors (Nursery and Primary) (BIP) (2013-2014)

Under the Bulgarian Presidency, the BIP worked, applying the principle of continuity, on the following topics:

## 1.1 Assessment in the primary cycle of the European Schools

The working group continued its work on finalisation of the document 'Assessment tools in the primary cycle of the European Schools', including the School Report. The document was approved, including the final version of the School Report. Translations into all the languages of the School Report and of the assessment criteria must follow, to allow the ICT Unit to incorporate the means of assessment into the School Management System (SMS). It should be pointed out that a decentralised training course on the new School Report was provided for the primary school teachers.

Other means of assessment were also devised – pupils' entry profiles and guidelines on how to use the portfolio.

Following the decision of the Board of Inspectors (Nursery and Primary), the primary school curriculum and the individual syllabuses have to be amended on the basis of the new assessment concept and of the new structure, applicable to all the curricula and syllabuses of the European Schools. The working group will continue its work on evaluation and monitoring of and follow-up on implementation of the new assessment tools for the primary cycle until 2016.

## I.2 Report of the 'European Hours' Working Group

Following the formation of the new 'European Hours' Working Group, based on a mandate given by the BIP, it is developing the syllabus and defining all the competences in this subject which pupils need to master. These competences are rooted in three principles: think European, feel and be European-minded and act European. The structure and content of the syllabus are in the process of being designed and written. This syllabus follows the new structure for all syllabuses in the European Schools. The inspectors discussed the creation of a logo for this subject, a change to its name and the choice of the language of tuition.

The BIP encouraged the 'European Hours' Working Group to continue its work and its efforts along the same lines, making the following points:

- It endorsed the proposal to change the name.
- It invited the working group to reflect on the choice of the language of tuition for this subject. It is supposed to be taught in L2 but unfortunately that is not always the case. This problem needs to be resolved and teaching in Language 2 made mandatory, as during those hours pupils use their Language 2 for the first time outside actual Language 2 lessons.
- As far as the 'knowledge' part is concerned, a large number of tools designed for children will be provided by the European Council.

## I.3 Planning of revision of the introduction to the Early Education Curriculum

This Curriculum was implemented in September 2011. In accordance with the decision to revise it two years later, i.e. in 2013-2014, the teachers gave positive feedback.

It is proposed to continue its revision in conjunction with the 'Assessment in the primary cycle' Working Group.

## I.4 Organisation

The official start of use of the School Report by the schools for parents' benefit is scheduled for February 2015. Prior to that, the period of initial tests in SMS will be October and November 2014.

## 1.5 Transparency

To sum up, it is laudable that the inspectors are thoroughly familiar with their tasks and responsibilities. Our Presidency would encourage the inspectors to be proactive and to formulate proposals to be considered.

In accordance with the principles of transparency and fairness, posts available and new posts to be created in the working groups are communicated to the inspectors in good time.

## II. Board of Inspectors (Secondary) (BIS)

The work of the BIS is based on the inspectors' experience, gained by discharging their obligations and by participating actively in working groups and in relevant meetings.

During the last school year the BIS continued its work, taking account of the previous Presidency's recommendations, with particular reference to the European Baccalaureate. The inspectors intensified their work on continuation of the reform of the European Baccalaureate and of the changes to secondary education. At the meetings they approved a large number of important documents concerning quality assurance in the secondary cycle:

### II.1 European Baccalaureate (EB):

- New structure for the Language 3 written and oral examinations in the EB, including the assessment criteria for the written and oral examinations and examples.
- 'Transitional and final provisions' of the Arrangements for implementing the Regulations for the European Baccalaureate applicable for the 2014 EB session.
- Quality assurance of the written and oral examinations.
- Special arrangements for assessment of the written examinations in the EB.
- Quality assurance of the content of the oral examinations in the EB procedure to be followed by the inspectors as from 2014.

#### II.2 Curricula and syllabuses:

- Presentation of new syllabuses by subject, and
- Amendment of existing and approved syllabuses: for example, for careers guidance in the secondary cycle, ICTC S1-S3, 4-period Geography S6-S7 (amendments).

The chairs of the working groups presented their respective reports to the BIS, including the status of progress on production of the document in question. The BIS subsequently deliberated on the proposals made, according to the nature of the documents.

A whole range of centralised and decentralised training courses on implementation of the new syllabuses were organised and run.

## III. Joint Board of Inspectors (JBI)

In accordance with the priorities and tasks defined at the beginning of the school year, the Joint Board of Inspectors examined at its meetings the documents presented, which had already been discussed by the BIP and the BIS, including:

- III.1 Evaluation of Directors and Deputy Directors 2014-2015 school year
  To ensure transparency, the inspectors rotate amongst themselves each year to form the teams for evaluation of Directors and Deputy Directors.
- III.2 Pedagogical Development and Quality Assurance of the European Schools (2012-2013) Long and short-term planning

This document is designed to inform the inspectors about the activities carried out in 2012-2013 and about their results and the work that will need to be continued. Some amendments were made and it then went forward to the Joint Teaching Committee (JTC). A decision was taken that the document would be appended to the Joint Report of the Presidency of the Boards of Inspectors (2012-2013).

III.3 Pedagogical Development and Quality Assurance of the European Schools (2013-2014) – Long and short-term planning

At its February 2014 meeting, the Board of Inspectors (Secondary) approved this updated document and the changes and amendments made to it, including the Presidency's priorities for the 2013-2014 school year. This document is based on the results of the activities engaged in by the Boards of Inspectors during the past school year and shows the work to be continued and/or finalised during the coming school year. Planning of the activities involved in achievement of the objectives and of the pedagogical tasks to be performed for quality assurance purposes illustrates application of the principles of transparency and continuity.

III.4 Documents 'Quality Assurance procedure for the approval of curricula (syllabuses) in the European Schools' and 'Guidelines for the management and publication of the curricula (syllabuses) of the European Schools'

The JBI approved those two documents and, in view of their importance for the quality of education, decided on their immediate implementation.

III.5 Reports on the inspections conducted

The JBI scrutinised the different reports on the inspections conducted at the Alicante, Brussels I, Culham, Luxembourg I and Karlsruhe Schools. Those reports take account of both the positive and negative aspects of the school's activity. They make recommendations to the school concerned for improvement of certain aspects of school activities. The JBI has reached the end of its round of visits to the schools and will present a general report on the subject in February 2015.

# III.6 Presentation of the final report on the new system of assessment in the secondary cycle

After consultation of the different Boards and Committees, the various representatives failed to reach unanimous agreement on the proposal, which was therefore remitted to the working group so that it could some amendments. The new proposal will be presented at the October meetings.

## III.7 Pilot project on means of assessment of teaching

The JBI and the JTC approved the new teaching standards, which will enter into force as from September 2014, and the development of tools and the pilot project for implementation of the Guidelines for reflection, observation/(self-)evaluation of nursery, primary and secondary school teachers in the European Schools. In the near future, the working group will also begin devising a continuous professional development policy and implementation of a pilot project on means for evaluation of teachers. Representatives of the Directors/Deputy Directors and of the teachers will join the working group.

## III.8 General Rules of the European Schools

Proposals for updating of the General Rules of the European Schools pertaining to:

- continuation of the new educational support policy,
- updating of Annex II Table of equivalences of teaching levels/year groups,
- updating of Annex III National days, and
- continuation of the amendments to the Arrangements for implementing the Regulations for the European Baccalaureate, were approved by the JBI and the other Boards and Committees concerned.

# III.9 Audit reports on the Centre for European Schooling, Dunshaughlin, Ireland and European Schooling Helsinki and the School of European Education, Heraklion

These audits of Accredited Schools are conducted by the inspectors of the European Schools in order to guarantee compliance with the agreements signed between these Accredited Schools and the Board of Governors, represented here by its Secretary-General. Taking account of the results of the inspections conducted the JBI formulated proposals to the Board of Governors.

## **IV. Joint Teaching Committee (JTC)**

#### IV.1 Syllabuses

In total 15 syllabuses were proposed in 2013-2014, breaking down into 9 new syllabuses that were approved with entry into force in September 2014, 2 new syllabuses that were approved in October 2013 with immediate entry into force and 4 syllabuses that were amended in 2013-2014 with immediate entry into force. The full list of the syllabuses in question approved by the JTC can be found in Annex 1 to this document.

#### IV.2 Organisation.

# 2.1 Report of the 'Organisation of studies in the secondary cycle' Working Group

The JTC was informed of the progress of the activities associated with reform of the secondary cycle. The Board of Governors approved the plan for years S1-S3 and its implementation will start in September 2014. The external evaluation must include not only years S6-S7, but also S4-S5. The working group has drawn up a calendar for that purpose. The different Boards and Committees asked to be informed about the outcome of the external evaluation and the calendar for implementation of each change.

- 2.2 At its meetings during this school year, the JTC examined and discussed documents and approved some of them or gave certain mandates, such as:
  - EUROSPORT Request for an increase in the budget for this event's organisation.
  - Guidelines on organising student exchanges in the European Schools. The JTC gave a mandate for the formation of a working group, charged with amending this document if need be.
  - The JTC took note of the document 'Statistics on the integration of SEN pupils into the European Schools in 2013'. The Committee considered that the schools need more time and means for coordination of educational support and the necessary resources. The JTC invited the Board of Governors to take a decision on the question of an increase in the resources granted to the schools for the coordination of educational support and to give a

mandate to the 'Educational Support' Working Group, if necessary, to carry out a more detailed analysis of the question.

2.3 The document 'Posts created by the Board of Governors at the December 2013 meeting and posts remaining unfilled by replacements for the 2014-2015 school year '

A new layout for the posts to be filled in the schools document was approved. The approved document is designed in particular to change the procedure for elimination of posts remaining unfilled.

#### IV.3 Assessment

The document 'Harmonised assessment at the end of year 5 and written examinations leading to B marks in year 5'

Following a thorough discussion of the proposals made seeking to amend this document, the JTC approved the immediate entry into force of the updated document (2013-05-D-34-3), provided that the inspectors made checks. The JTC gave a mandate to the BIS to compose a temporary working group to produce a document that is easy to read and to interpret.

In view of the above, it can be said that the principles of unity and continuity are applied for the purposes of quality assurance of the education offered by our schools.

#### Conclusion

The work of the inspectors, of the Boards of Inspectors and of the Joint Teaching Committee during this school year was productive. It focused primarily on achievement of the priorities planned and on improvement of the education offered in the European Schools.

This positive outcome would not have been achieved without the support and the close cooperation of the inspectors with all concerned, namely the pupils, parents, teachers, Deputy Directors, Directors, representatives of the European Commission and, last but not least, without the invaluable cooperation of the Office of the Secretary-General.

#### Introduction

The setting of the pedagogical objectives as well as the quality assurance of the European Schools type I are a responsibility of the different Boards of Inspectors:

- Board of Nursery and Primary Inspectors
- Board of Secondary Inspectors
- Joint Board of Inspectors.

The pedagogical development unit of the Secretary-general supports and coordinates the (preparatory) activities of the Boards of Inspectors.

The purpose of the present document is to provide each new school year a transparent view of:

- The pedagogical needs as they were identified by the Boards of Inspectors, Joint Teaching Committee or Board of Governors
- The activities that are planned to satisfy these needs
- The expected and attained results
- The plan of the activities
- The results at the end of the school year.

In order to achieve the different goals within the organisational and budgetary resources a long and short time planning is developed. At the beginning of each school year the Joint Board of Inspectors will decide on the prior needs to be tackled, the activities to be organised and the responsibilities to be taken during the coming school year.

Projects that have come to an end (after 2 or 3 year maximum) will be replaced by new priorities. Also long term issues can come to an end or be integrated in a smaller or larger target. According to the needs (and resources) the presidency can submit new priorities to the Joint Board of Inspectors.

## Priorities of the presidency 2013-2014

In the light of the actual growth of the European Schools type I - by population as well as adhering member states - the need to keep an overall view on our responsibilities and tasks is clearly felt by the inspectors.

With the help of the pedagogical development unit we want to invest in coherence, transparency and continuity.

The priorities of the presidency 2013-2014 are:

- the harmonisation of L2 syllabuses with the European Framework of Reference;
- the revision/adaptation of syllabuses by subject in view of shifting their focus from knowledge-based to competence-based;
- the harmonisation of teaching methods in view of the implementation of teaching standards by regular inschool exchanges of experience /attending other teachers' classes of the same type, for example teaching geography in French and teaching Geography in German or teaching Spanish or English as L3.
- assessment of pupils.

The Boards of Inspectors provide the pedagogical legitimisation of the European School system. Very often inspectors combine their work for the European Schools with other national duties. We want to pay respect for their passion and sustainable efforts by making their work behind the scenes more visible.

## I. Working groups

The Working groups are divided into several categories:

## 1. Long-term planning

The Boards of Inspectors take initiatives to respond to ongoing/recurrent pedagogical needs. The subsequent educational challenges are monitored in the long term by structural groups.

## 2. Reference groups

Some issues need to be debated and followed up with different partners of the ES (e.g. parents, students). The Boards do not just give a specific mandate but also specify the group's composition.

## 3. Short-term planning

The Boards of Inspectors take initiatives to tackle issues that need a clear, concrete answer in the short term (max. 2-3 years).

## 4. Syllabuses

The Boards of Inspectors are responsible for the development, approval and implementation of the syllabuses. The syllabuses are at the heart of the quality of education. They are revised regularly according to new educational objectives. A time frame of 1-2-3 years on average is foreseen depending on the newness of the syllabus to be developed or revised.

#### V. Results in 2013-2014

- 83 operational working groups, chaired by the Inspectors, which 148 meetings in all, with a total of 183 meeting days (from September 2013 to August 2014).
- 19 in-service training courses for the nursery, primary and secondary teachers (from September 2013 to June 2014).
- 86 inspection visits essentially inspections that are mandatory under the Regulations for Members of the Seconded Staff) between September and December 2013).
- 3 team inspections on the new Whole School Inspection model and 2 follow-up inspections on the initial team inspection.
- Revision of the organisation of studies in S1-S3
